Safeguarding Children Policy for Chobham & District Rifle Club

Introduction:

Children participating in sports clubs place their trust in the adults responsible for their well-being and safety. Therefore, it is essential to have a robust and comprehensive safeguarding policy in place to protect children from all forms of abuse. This document aims to outline a safeguarding children policy for sports clubs in the UK, covering the key principles, responsibilities, procedures, and measures to ensure the protection of children at all times.

Policy Statement:

The policy affirms the commitment of the sports club to provide a safe and secure environment for all children involved in its activities.

The policy emphasises the club's responsibility to fully comply with the relevant statutory requirements and work in accordance with established safeguarding guidance.

The policy highlights the importance of promoting a culture of openness, awareness, and accountability regarding safeguarding children.

Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL):

The club will appoint a Designated Safeguarding Lead responsible for overseeing safeguarding matters and ensuring that appropriate safeguarding training is undertaken by staff and volunteers.

The DSL will act as the main point of contact for concerns or disclosures relating to child protection and coordinate the club's response to such instances.

Volunteers and club trainers working with children and young people under the age of 18:

All individuals working directly with children must possess an enhanced Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) certificate and be aware of the safeguarding contact information and guidance (outlined at the bottom of this policy)

Conduct:

Club members, volunteers, parents, and children should promote fairness, equality, and respect while avoiding any form of physical, emotional, or sexual abuse.

Reporting Procedures:

The process for reporting concerns or incidents of child abuse, including clarity on who to report to, how to record incidents, and the importance of confidentiality is outlined in the contact details below In the first instance the designated safeguarding lead should be contacted, however if there is immediate concerns and the designated lead is not available a report should be made as per the guidance at the bottom of the policy

Training and Education:

The Designated safeguarding lead will undertake training as appropriate to the role

Other club members should consider child safeguarding training as appropriate. All club members over the age of 18 should be made aware of the safeguarding policy

Communication and Information Sharing:

Parents, guardians, and children will be made aware of the club's safeguarding policies, procedures.

The club and members should be aware of the importance of effective communication, maintaining child welfare as a priority, and encouraging open dialogue between parents, children, and the club's designated safeguarding lead.

Monitoring and Review:

The policy will specify a process for regular monitoring and review to ensure its effectiveness and compliance with legal requirements.

Children's participation within the club

All junior members (under the age of 18 years old) should be supervised by a parent, guardian, or designated individual whilst attending the club. The child supervisor should ensure that they are with the child at all times Any concerns that the child supervisor has should be immediately highlighted to a full club member and to the designated child safeguarding lead as soon as possible

The child supervisor remains responsible for the well being of the child at ALL TIMES whilst the child is present within the club or undertaking any activities related to, or as part of the CDRC.
